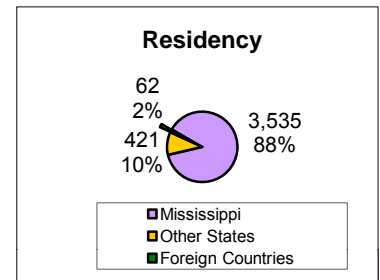
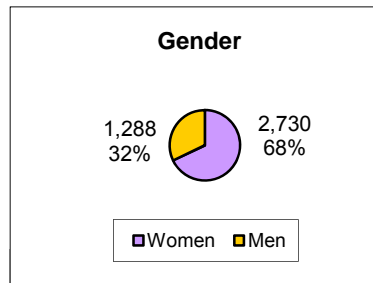
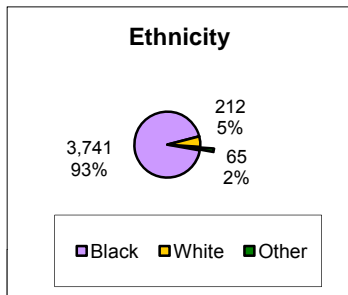
- The first year retention rate of first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshmen who entered in Fall 2010 and returned in Fall 2011 is 67%.

TYPE

Alcorn State University is a land-grant, residential University. It is one of eight state-assisted institutions of higher learning in the state of Mississippi.

LOCATION

The University is located in Claiborne County, Mississippi, 7 miles west of Lorman, 17 miles southwest of Port Gibson, and 45 miles south of Vicksburg. State Highway 552, 1 mile north of Lorman, Mississippi, leads directly to the campus.

CAMPUS

The University encompasses 1,756 acres: campus and athletic fields 300 acres; agriculture and research 1,456 acres.

STUDENTS

Headcount enrollment for Fall 2011 was 4,018: 1,288 males, 2,730 females; 3,155 full-time, 863 part-time; 3,296 undergraduates, and 722 graduate students.

FACULTY

Full-time faculty for Fall 2011 totaled 177: 36 professors, 34 associate professors, 61 assistant professors, and 46 instructors, holding 110 doctorates, 1 first professionals, 0 specialists, 66 masters, and 0 bachelor.

DEGREES

563 degrees were awarded in the Spring of 2012: 28 associates, 380 bachelors, 161 masters, and 0 specialists.

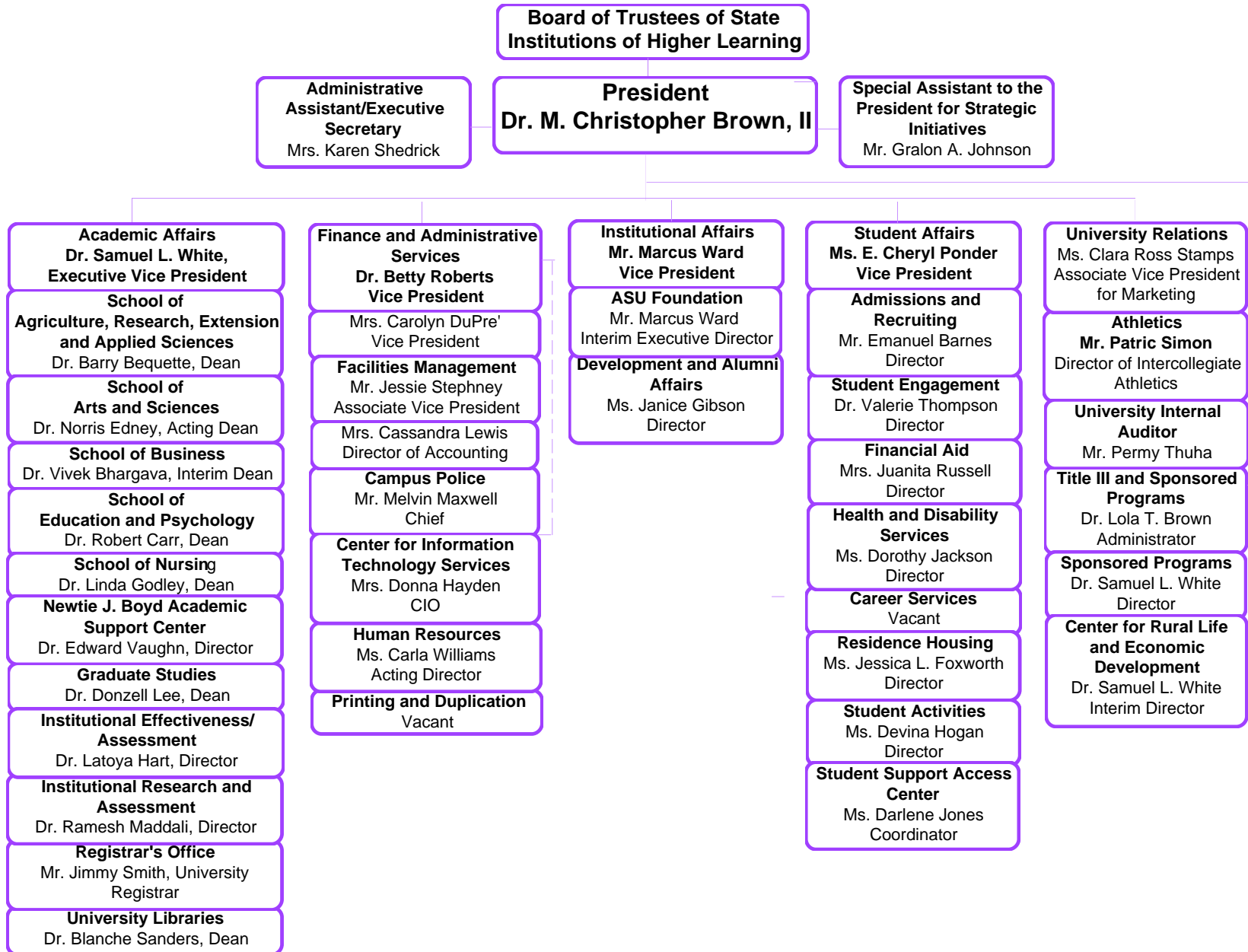

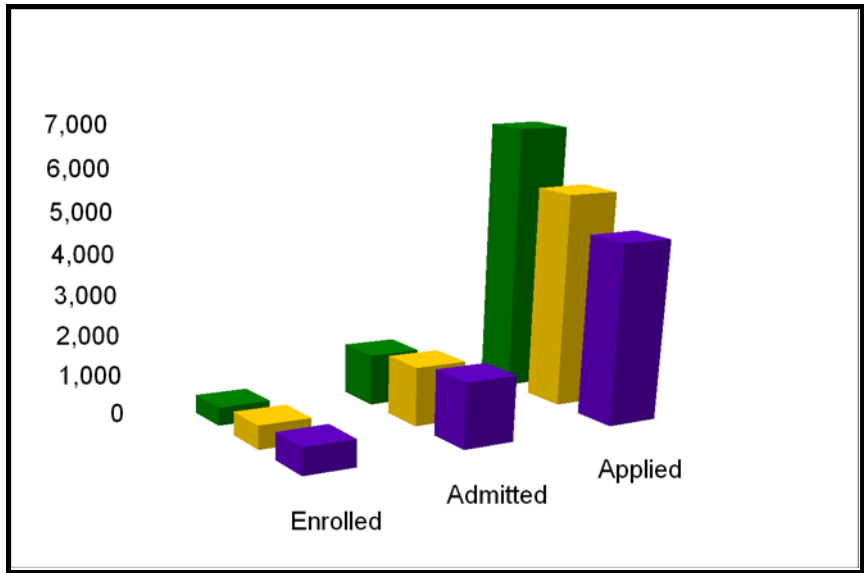
Alcorn State University Organizational Chart

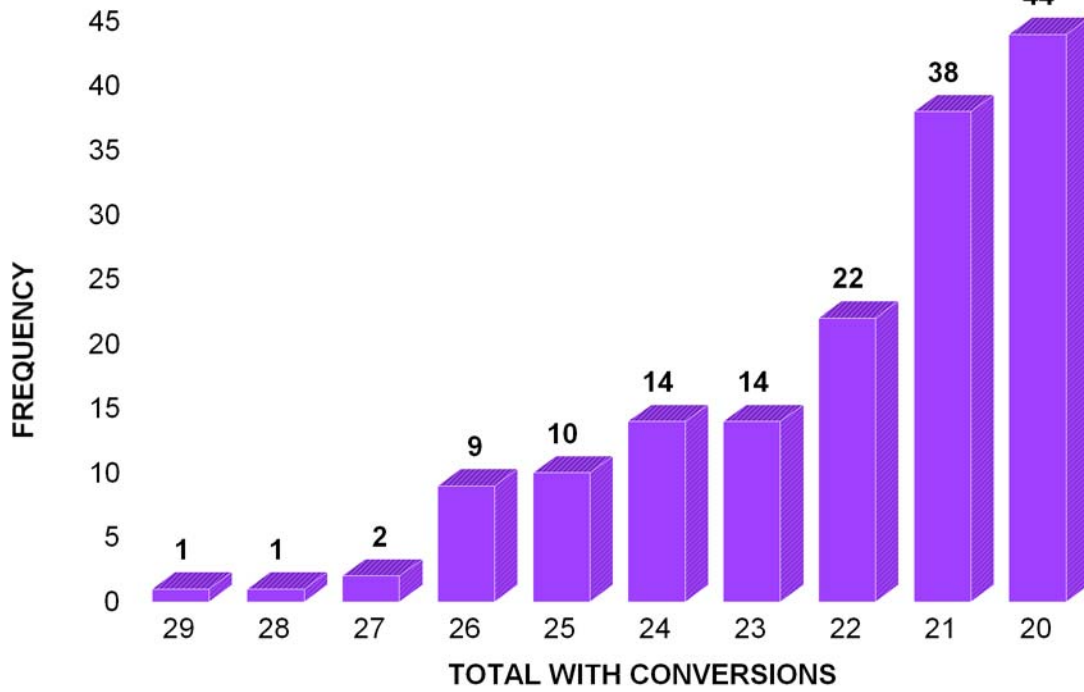

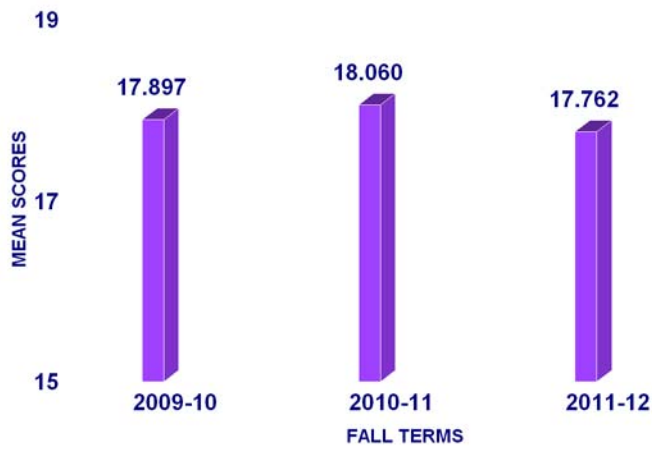

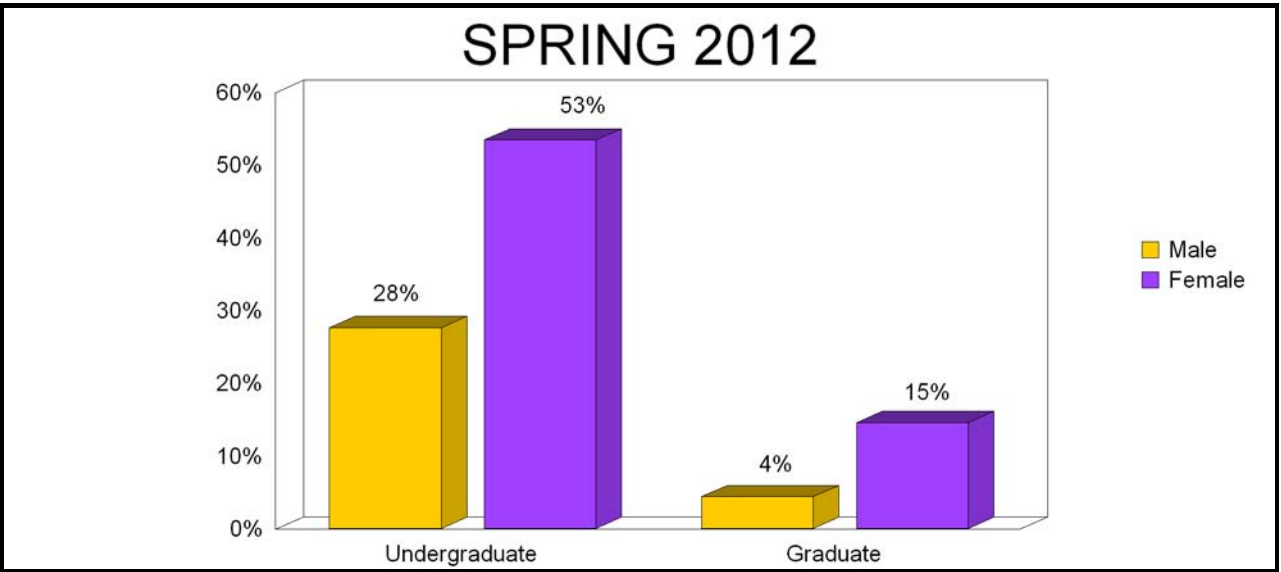
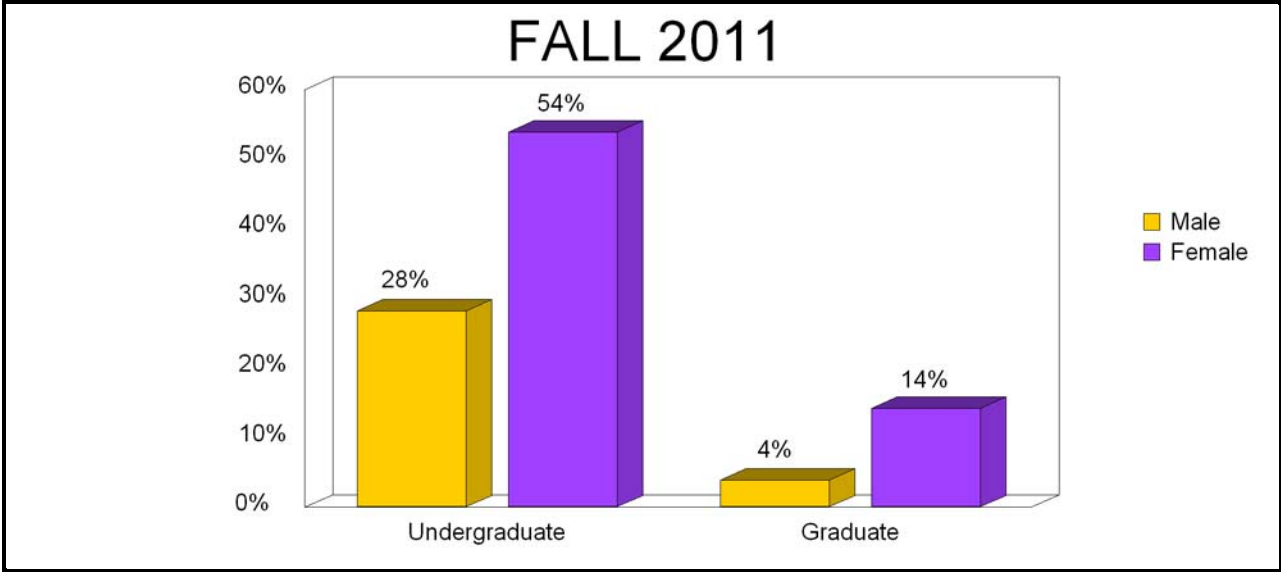

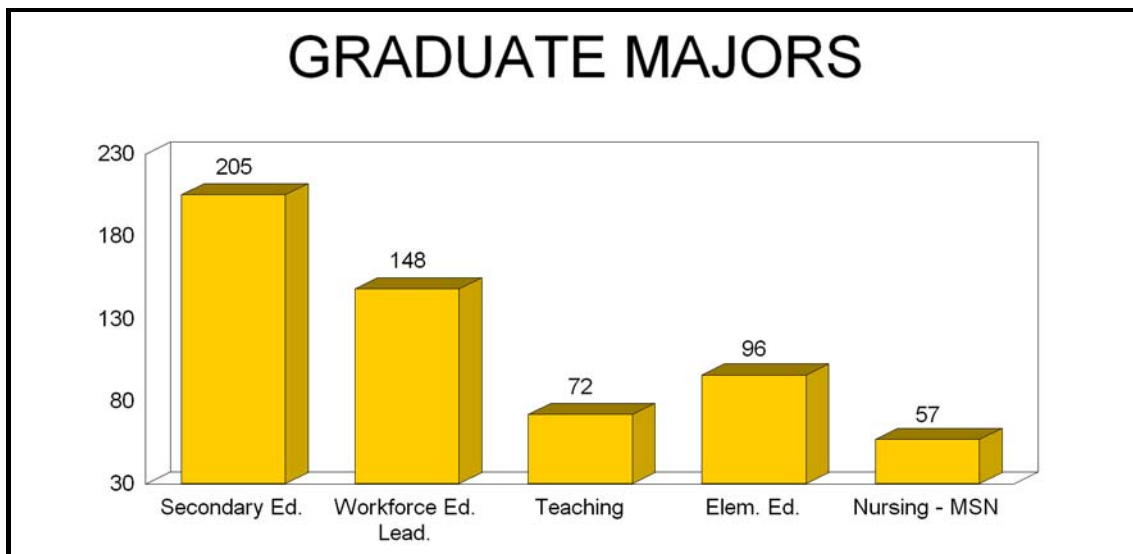
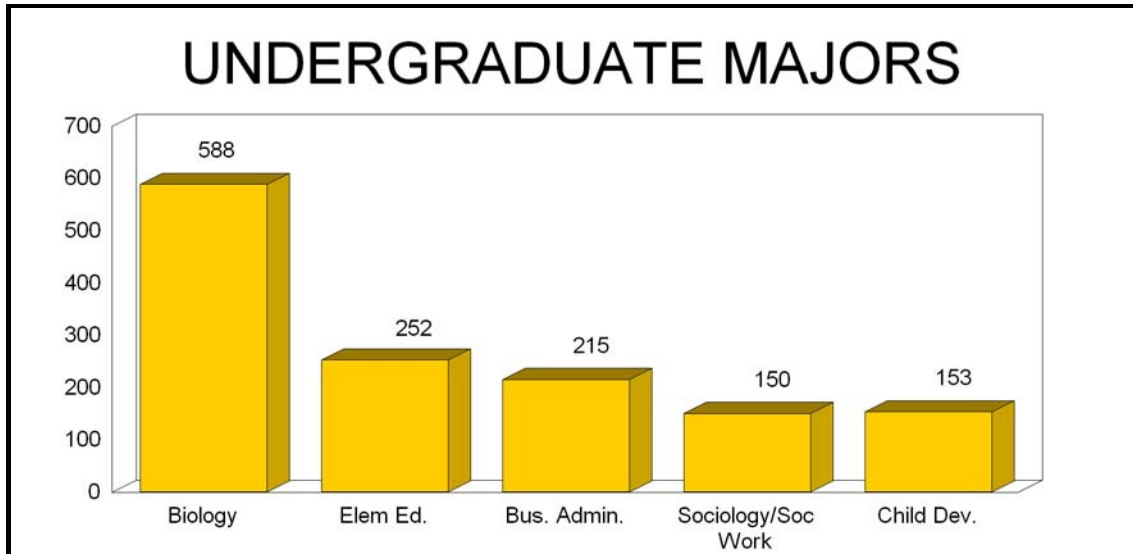

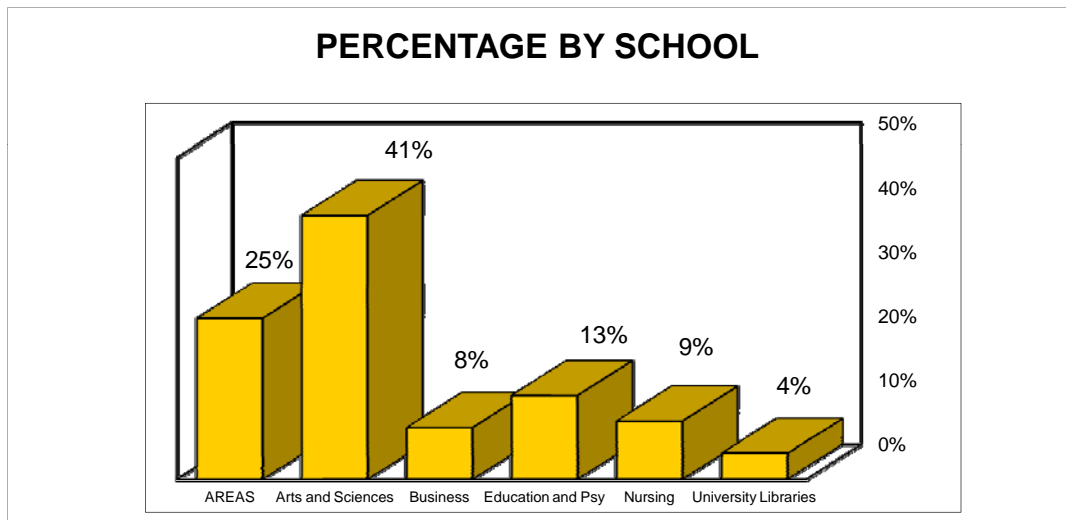
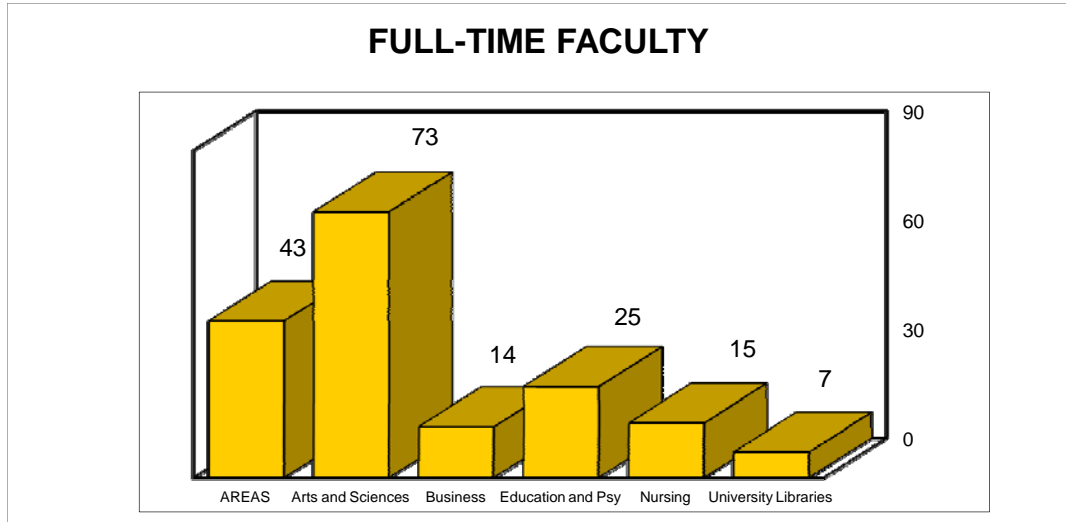

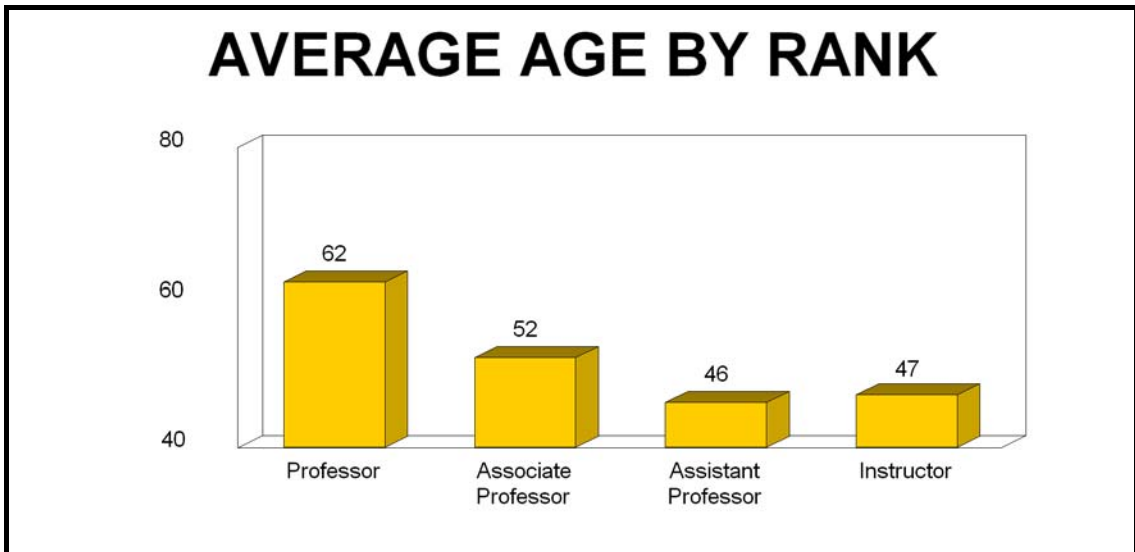
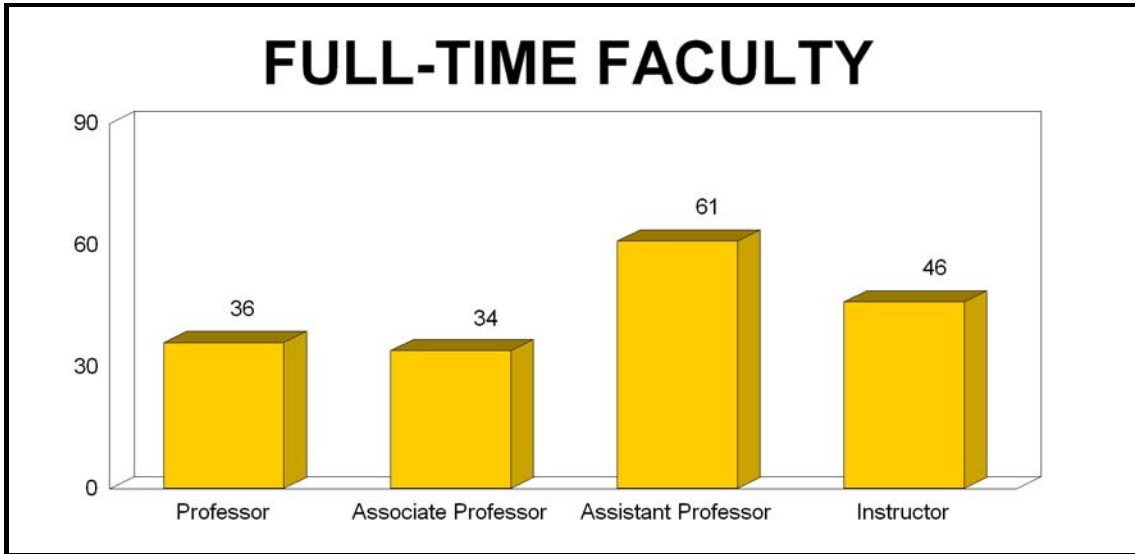

ALCORN STATE UNIVERSITY EDUCATIONAL AND GENERAL EXPENDITURES FISCAL YEAR 2011

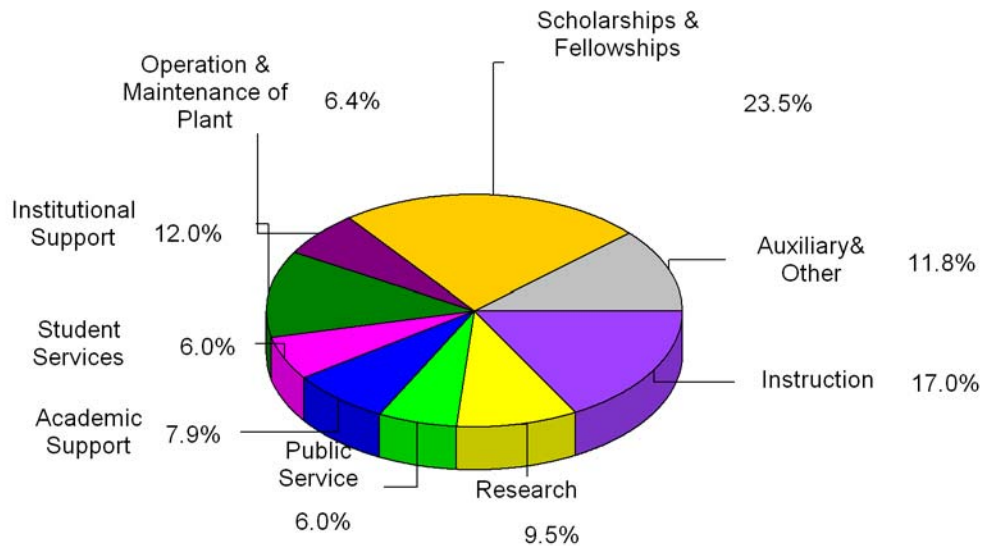
