





## ***GENERAL INFORMATION***

## PROFILE OF THE UNIVERSITY

**TYPE:** Alcorn State University is a land-grant, residential University. It is one of eight state-assisted institutions of higher learning in the state of Mississippi.

**SCHOOLS:** School of Arts and Sciences, School of Agriculture, Research, Extension and Applied Sciences, School of Business, School of Education and Psychology, College for Excellence, School of Graduate Studies, and School of Nursing.

**LOCATION:** The University is located in Claiborne County, Mississippi, 7 miles west of Lorman, 17 miles southwest of Port Gibson, and 45 miles south of Vicksburg. State Highway 552, 1 mile north of Lorman, Mississippi, leads directly to the campus.

**CAMPUS:** The University encompasses 1,756 acres: campus and athletic fields 300 acres; agriculture and research 1,456 acres.

**STUDENTS:** Headcount enrollment for Fall 2009 was 3,334: 1,055 males, 2,279 females, 2,641 full-time, 693 part-time, 2,700 undergraduates, and 634 graduate students.

**FACULTY:** Full-time faculty for Fall 2009 totaled 200: 34 professors, 37 associate professors, 72 assistant professors, and 57 instructors, holding 118 doctorates, 4 first professionals, 1 specialists, 75 masters, and 2 bachelor.

**DEGREES:** 524 degrees were awarded in the Spring of 2010: 29 associates, 357 bachelors, 138 masters, and 0 specialists.

Alcorn State University, an historically Black College and University, is a comprehensive land-grant institution that celebrates a rich heritage with a diverse student and faculty population. 


# Alcorn State University Organizational Chart












**FTE - Undergraduate and Graduate**







# IN-STATE ENROLLMENT BY COUNTY SPRING 2010










