Housed in the Joyce J. Bolden Fine Arts Building, the Department of Fine Arts offers classes in Art, Humanities, Speech, Theater, and Music. The department is also home to the ASU Concert Choir, The (Sounds of Dyn-O-Mite) Marching Band, Wind Ensemble, Jazz Ensembles, Brass Ensembles, Woodwind Ensembles, Strings, Men's Choral, Chamber Singers, Women Choral and the ASU Steel and Percussion Ensemble. The department includes award-winning faculty and staff. We offer professional degree programs in the following areas: Music Education Vocal, Music Education Instrumental, Music Performance Vocal, Music Performance Instrumental and the Bachelor of Arts in (General) music. Not a Music major, well you can still enjoy the Arts through various programs sponsored in part by the ASU Fine Arts Department.

## Art

The program offered by the art area is unique in that instead of concentrating on students with a special talent for art, it focuses on the general education of all students to expand their range of ideas and to enhance their understanding of mankind, to increase vocabulary by writing and speaking about art, and to introduce students to drawing and design as a means of communication. Students may take a range of introductory level courses either as electives or to supplement their major fields.

## **Speech and Theatre**

The speech and theatre area offers services for students interested in speech and theatre either as an enhancement of their academic program or as a means of enriching their leisure time activity. Speech aids students in improving communication skills, expressing thoughts more clearly, and gaining confidence in front of audiences. Its purpose is to try to help students clarify ideas and to express them orally. The theatre program provides students with both practical experience in the production of plays, and historical and critical insight into the theatre as a medium of communication of ideas and emotion.

#### Audition Day Requirements for Scholarships- open to all majors

#### **Instrumental, Vocal and String Auditions**

Prepare 2-4 minutes of music to play at the audition. Choose repertoire that demonstrates your technical ability and musical skills. Do not select music that is too difficult for your, or that you have not thoroughly prepared. Students will be asked to sightread a short music passage.

Brass: All major Scales

Chromatic Scale Solo or Etude

Piano: All Major Scales Both Hands

Solo or Etude Preferably from the Classical or Romantic repertoire

Percussion: All major scales

Solo or Etude on at least two different instruments: Snare Drum, Timpani, Mallets and or Drum Set

40 International Rudiments

Strings: Violin, viola, cello

Two pieces of contrasting character. At least one of the pieces should be played from memory. Pieces chosen should demonstrate the applicant's ability in phrasing, sustained playing, and technical facility, including varied bow strokes and tempi.

A 3 octaves Major scale chosen by the applicant, played in quarter notes, slurred 3 or 4 per

bow.

Tempo should be quarter note = 80.

**Classical Bass** 

One movement from the standard solo repertoire

One etude selected by the applicant

One three-octave major scale with arpeggio

Woodwinds: All major scales

Solo or Etude Sight Reading

Voice: Demonstrate the ability to match pitches

Solo or Etude
